I.T.S Dental College, Hospital and Research Centre has always considered education of students paramount. In addition to the routine classes, college has also introduced Mentor Ward System. In this, on an average, 15 to 20 students are allotted to one particular faculty. The appointed faculty conducts monthly meetings with their allocated students. The purpose of this meeting is to understand how the student is feeling in our institution. The meeting is held in an informal atmosphere, over a cup of tea and snacks. The purpose is to make the student comfortable enough to discuss his or her problems. Because only ten to twenty students are allocated per faculty, the faculty can give ample amount of time and attention to each and every student. The discussions include not only the academic progress of the student, but on the whole, how the student is dealing with the pressures of a professional environment. After college hours, how the student spends his or her time, is also touched upon, as it is imperative that students have a social life too, as a relief to the sometime stressed up professional situations. In a completely non formal atmosphere, subjects ranging from peer pressure to any difficulties faced in academics is discussed. The status of clinical quota of the students in various departments is also discussed. Any difficulty encountered in hostel, quality of mess food, issues with colleagues, difficulty in understanding any subject are some of the other points of discussion. Post this discussion the faculty in charge comprises a list of the points and the action needed to be taken for them. This is then discussed with the concerned authority and necessary action taken to alleviate the problem faced by the student.
